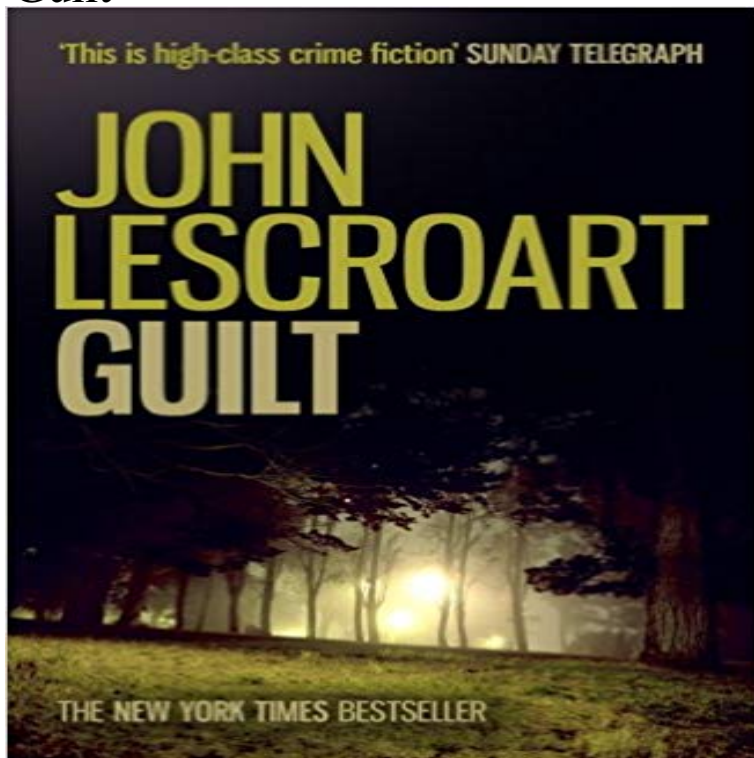


Guilt
